#### **SEAM - Report of Trustees for Second Quarter of 2016**

The trustees met on 30th April and 4th June. Following views expressed expressed at Area Meeting a simplified cash collection policy and procedure was developed.

Following the receipt of much delayed advice from Friends Trusts Ltd, the draft Charity Commission scheme was finalised. This will have the affect to combining all the local meetings, meeting houses and burial grounds into a single charity.

#### **Finance**

Trustees continued to keep the state of the whole Area Meeting's finances under review. Work on the 2015 accounts was nearing completion so that the deadline for submission to the Charity October Commission of 30th should be achievable. The review investments and financial controls was ongoing but had resulted in the drafting of a revised investment policy.

#### Risk

The risk register was kept under review. The attention of Area Meeting had been drawn to the fact that the Safeguarding Coordinator was unable to fulfil all the roles of the post as provided for in the Safeguarding Policy, however it appeared that this problem had not been satisfactorily addressed.

#### **Employees**

Volunteer resident friends had been appointed to serve in Lewes. The self employed status of the children's worker at Lewes had been clarified. The 2% pay rise for the cleaners at Hastings and Eastbourne had been actioned.

#### Bexhill

The quinquennial survey had been done and the report was awaited.

#### Lewes

The Premises Committee had kept trustees fully informed concerning their work.

#### **Eastbourne**

Local Friends had arranged exterior redecoration. The ongoing problem of damp ingress in the meeting room had been thoroughly investigated and it was hoped that a lasting solution could be implemented.

#### Herstmonceux

A survey of Friends Cottage had been carried out to try to get to the bottom of the damp problems; the report was awaited. As was reported at Area Meeting, work with Wealden District Council and our letting agents had been ongoing with a view to leasing 1 Penn Cottage to the Council to enable them to house a refugee family there.

The quinquennial survey was being considered by Herstmonceux Friends.
